BROOKINGS, S.D. - SDSU Extension and the State 4-H Office invite all 4-H Leaders, volunteers, parents of 4-H members and those interested in volunteering to attend the first of four 4-H Leader Trainings held October 18, 2016 from 7 to 9 p.m. (CST) at all eight SDSU Extension Regional Centers and in Brookings on the campus of South Dakota State University.

During this meeting, which will be the first to be held quarterly during the 2016-2017 4-H year, leaders and volunteers will have the opportunity to learn about the following:

- Volunteer opportunities: learn about re-certification opportunities and promotional pieces that will help recruit more volunteers;
- Youth Development Training;
- Character All-Stars: During this session you will learn: how schools may participate; about the GROW YOUR SELFie, a six-lesson series and how you can bring the lessons back to your club and county;
- Networking and planning for future trainings.

The meetings will be led by SDSU Extension 4-H staff and experienced volunteers both remotely and in-person. "This will be an opportunity to start out the new 4-H year and keep up to date," explained Audrey Rider, SDSU Extension 4-H Volunteer Field Specialist.

Rider explained that the trainings will focus on a variety of training topics and keep everyone informed throughout the 4-H year.

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What's your BIG Idea? It could be worth \$1,000!



The BIG Idea Competition is launching its 10th year of competition this fall. High school students across South Dakota are invited to compete in this business idea competition, and winners will compete for up to \$5,000 in cash prizes and scholarships. The optional Marketing Design competition allows students to submit an ad for their idea and to compete for additional prize money. New this year is a Wellness Category sponsored by Sanford Health that awards an additional \$500 to the best business idea addressing wellness.

Students may work individually or as a team and will be able to submit their business idea applications online from September 1st through October 31st. The online application as well as various resources and examples can be accessed at the BIG Idea website: www.BIGIdeaSD.com.

All applications submitted by October 31st will be reviewed and ranked by several judges from the business community. The eight top scoring applications will be invited to the final competition which will be on December 8th at Northern State University.

4-H'er encourages others to “Share the Harvest” with local food pantries

It's harvest time across South Dakota – in both the grain field and people's backyard gardens.

Korbin Leddy, 12, and his family near Milbank, SD, are avid gardeners and often have more fresh produce than their family of five can eat. They will can some of their garden items, but they also donate surplus tomatoes, cucumbers, green beans and other produce to friends, their local church or their local Milbank food pantry.

Leddy, who has helped his 4-H club coordinate food drives for their local food pantry for several years, would like to encourage others to think about donating extra garden produce to local organizations as well.

Leddy says, “Most often we think of doing food drives at Christmastime, which is important. But it's important to donate to the food pantry year-round. In August and September when we have a surplus of fresh vegetables from our gardens, the food pantry is a great place to donate extra items to.” He also notes that such donations provide a fresh and healthy offering for individuals who rely on the food pantry.

Leddy has established a Facebook page to promote this effort, and is issuing a challenge to other youth across the state to donate fresh produce to their local food pantry, church or school. Individuals ages 18 and younger who post a photo of themselves with their donation at Share the Harvest_SD on Facebook will have the opportunity to win a \$25 dollar iTunes gift card. Photos must be posted by Sept. 30, 2016 and must show the individual with their donation in the location where they are making their donation such as a food pantry, church, or school. The post should also list the number of items donated (i.e. 2 dozen tomatoes and 8 cucumbers). The three individuals donating the largest number of items will each be contacted and receive an iTunes gift card for their efforts.

Through this challenge, Leddy hopes more people across the state will get to enjoy fresh, homegrown garden produce. And, he hopes that it will plant a seed with young people to continue volunteering and donating to worthy causes in their local communities.

Leddy is a six year member of the Madison Jr. Livestock 4-H Club in Grant County. He will be a seventh grader at Milbank Middle School. Learn more about his project at [Share the Harvest_SD](#) on Facebook.
