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Each holiday season, we at United Way of Greater Yankton operate the ADOPT-A-FAMILY holiday program, in conjunction with Toys for Kids, to help brighten the holidays for local families in need. Families are referred into both the ADOPT-A-FAMILY program and Toys for Kids by local service agencies.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE TOYS FOR KIDS ADOPT-A-FAMILY PROGRAM?

Any individual or group willing to help can participate. In the past, individuals, families, churches, neighborhood groups, schools, organizations, and businesses have all participated by adopting a family or donating gifts.

WHEN I ADOPT A FAMILY, WHAT IS EXPECTED OF ME/MY ORGANIZATION?

Donors provide gifts for families who would otherwise receive very little or nothing at all this holiday season. Gift examples include:

- Individually wrapped gifts for each child. We ask that children's gifts be educational, such as books / art supplies / coloring books / flashcards / board games / puzzles or STEM toys. Bedding / clothing / shoes and toiletries are also very much appreciated.
- If you are looking to donate gifts for the parents/guardians, we suggest household goods, such as towels / cleaning supplies / laundry soap / blankets / hats and gloves / or non-perishable food items. Restaurant gift cards / Summit Activity Center passes / or other family activity passes are also great ideas. Please do not include VISA or Walmart gift cards.
- Please mark each wrapped gift with the name of the recipient.

HOW DO I KNOW THE CHILD or FAMILY'S NEEDS?

United Way collects Gift Request Forms from each family referred into the program. After you sign up to adopt a family, we will distribute the toy requests, clothing sizes and other gift suggestions provided by the family as early as November 22nd, as we know that many like to do their shopping early and over the Thanksgiving weekend.

HOW ARE GIFTS DISTRIBUTED or WHERE DO WE DELIVER THE GIFTS?

United Way staff and community volunteers collect all gift donations for the ADOPT-A-FAMILY program, organize, and distribute to families the following day.

- We ask that you please deliver donated gifts to the **South Training Center on the HSC Campus, between 12noon-6:00pm on Monday, December 11th**
- Bring all gifts in large bags, totes or boxes. Please label all bags, totes, or boxes with your company, department, or individual name. This makes organizing and delivering the gifts much easier.
