Spring Training

- Step 2: Click sign in with 4HOnline icon.
- <u>Step 3:</u> Select SD 4-H Youth Development from the drop down menu.
- <u>Step 4:</u> Login to your 4HOnline account.
- <u>Step 5:</u> Select the youth who you wish to sign up for a training.
- <u>Step 6:</u> Select the course applicable based on youth's 4-H age.
- <u>Step 7:</u> Select the training the youth will attend.
- <u>Step 8:</u> Add a credit card and pay \$3 online or use the voucher code. **each child will be a separate transaction*

Pick-a-Chick

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to show poultry? Maybe you're a Cloverbud, and you are ready to add responsibility to your day.

If so, we have the perfect project for you!

This spring we will again be offering the Pick-A-Chick program with breeder Reynold Loecker. Youth from ages 5-18 will have the opportunity to learn from a poultry breeder how to care for and show poultry. They will be able to purchase exhibition type show Bantams (smaller than many farm chickens you may be familiar with) for \$5 a chick. Chicks live best in groups so a minimum of 5 is recommended.

Chicks would need to be purchased in early March. Please let me know before January 3rd if you are interested in purchasing a bird. At that time I would need to know how many birds you would like to

purchase so I can send an order in.

At the end of the summer, there are opportunities to return the birds or sell the birds back to the breeder if you cannot care for them over the winter.

Early in March, birds will need to be kept in basements or garages in a box with a heat lamp until they feather out. If this is a concern for anyone, let me know and we can discuss what the best options would be for you to care for a bird.

Again, if you are at all interested in this opportunity, please let me (Katie) know so I can get everything lined up with our breeder, Reynold Loecker.

Rules and Regulations

Cattle Specifications

- Calves must be born in 2019 or fall heifers are eligible to participate but they must be born in the 2018 year. Market heifers are eligible to participate. Please indicate market or breeding heifer when registering. Cow/calf pairs do not qualify. Classes to be determined in each division after calves measured.
- <u>Market heifers and steers</u> will be broken down by breed and weight.
- <u>Breeding heifers</u> will be broken down by breed and age.
- Registration papers/ proof of registration are required for breeding heifers or they will show commercial.
- Health papers required for all entries.

Entry Procedures

- Entry fee \$30 per calf until Monday, January 6th; \$50 per calf after January 6th. No refunds unless show is cancelled due to weather.
- Entry fee must accompany entry form, payable to *Davison County Beef Show*.
- No entries accepted without entry fee paid.
- ALL CALVES must be checked in. Check in is available between 8:00 -10:00 am, January 11th, 2020.
- No re-weighing of calves.
- Entries may arrive January 11th. Facilities will be open at 7:30 am.

Facility Amenities/Rules

- No washing facilities are available. <u>Wood chips will not be available for purchase</u>. Generators encouraged. No stalling in the barn, cattle will stay on their trailer or in designated areas.
- All bedding and livestock areas, including parking lot, must be cleaned up prior to leaving the grounds (WOOD CHIPS ONLY).

Show Eligibility Requirements

- All participants must be registered/enrolled 4-H, FFA or breed association members for the 2019-2020 year. 4-H online registrations must be complete before show date.
- Open Class ages limited to 8 21 year olds as of October 1 of the current year as stated in the South Dakota Junior Point Show Association Beef Rules.
- Entry submission for 4-H show are open to Davison County clubs only. All other 4-H entries will be in the open class format. Davison entries can participate in *both* 4-H show and open class.
- This will be a NO Fit Show
- All decisions of show committee & Judge are final. Not responsible for accidents.
- Listen to KMIT (105.9) for cancellation information in case of bad weather. Information is also available on facebook (Davison County Winter Beef Show).

We are excited to announce that your SD 4-H Leaders Board has added the SDSU Youth Livestock Judging Camp to the list of camps that offers financial assistance. There is a \$50 scholarship available to any 4-H member that attends the camp. Other camps with a scholarship available are 4-H Camp at Poinsett, 4-H Youth Camp or Teen Camp at Bob Marshall, Teen Leadership Camp (TLC) and Performing Arts.

Here is how the scholarship program works.

- Step 1 Register for the 2019 camp and pay the full camp fees.
- Step 2 Attend camp and have a great time!!

• Step 3 – Tell a group about camp. For the \$25 4-H Camp scholarship, tell one group. For the \$50 TLC or Performing Arts Camp or Livestock Judging scholarship tell two groups.

• Step 4 – Complete the camp assistance/scholarship application form with all signatures and submit to the SD 4-H Leaders. You will receive your scholarship money within 2 weeks of its receipt. Applications are due by December 31, 2019.

**Please note – you must be a 4-H member to receive the scholarship.

Please be sure to complete all parts of the form! You must answer the "what did you learn" section and sign it!

2020 Citizenship Washington Focus Trip

What is CWF?

CWF is a week-long 4-H citizenship program for 4-H'ers, thousands of which come to the National 4-H Youth Conference Center in Chevy Chase, MD, each summer, to learn about the democratic process, their role as citizens, and experience our nation's capital. The 2020 South Dakota Delegation will travel to CWF June 20 – 28, 2020.

Who can participate?

4-H'ers ages 15-18, as of January 1 of the trip year are eligible to attend CWF. Contact the 4-H Youth Advisor for your County to determine other county-specific steps to apply for CWF. Counties give their selected CWF youth delegates initial instructions and forms in December to send to the State 4-H Office on/before January 10.

What does CWF cost?

The cost for the 2020 CWF is \$1,700 per youth delegate (transportation, lodging, and most meals). Some Leader Associations provide scholarships. Youth delegates should plan to bring approximately \$300 in spending money.

County Selection Process

CWF youth delegates are selected at a County level based on local policies and procedures. Delegates must be able to perform the following essential functions of the trip with or without reasonable accommodations:

- Age-appropriate social & intellectual skills to actively participate in all activities
- Physical stamina to walk long distance & endurance for participating in a 16-hour day

The State 4-H Office and the National 4-H Council coordinate registration, transportation, lodging, some meals, activities and events for the South Dakota delegation.

South Dakota 4-H'ers wishing to participate in CWF need to contact their 4-H Youth Advisor to find out if their County has CWF delegate reservations. If yes, then youth and their families need to complete the application steps the County and State 4-H Office require.





2020 National 4-H Conference Trip

Members of the South Dakota 4-H Program, have the opportunity to apply for National 4-H Conference scheduled for March 28 – April 2, 2020 in Chevy Chase, Maryland. Youth must be 16 – 18 years old by the date of the event to apply. Applicants should submit their applications to their local 4-H Youth Program Advisor. Upon approval, the 4-H Youth Program Advisor will submit the signed application, via email or USPS mail, to the State 4-H Office by January 1, 2020. A designated committee of 4-H Youth Development professionals and/or previous trip participants will review applications and notify youth who are selected to attend National 4-H Conference as a delegate. The National 4-H Conference trip is sponsored and fully funded by the South Dakota 4-H Livestock Industry Trust Fund.

The National 4-H Conference is a premier professional and leadership development event for 4-H members, ages 16 – 19, across the U.S. and its territories. The conference is administered by the National 4-H Headquarters of the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) within the **U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)**. Held annually, except for several years during World War II, the camp's mission is to assist in the development of the next generation's leaders. Delegates attend training workshops, become acquainted with government and have the opportunity to meet with state leaders. This experience has been a tradition for 4-H members since 1927. In 1958, the event name, formerly known as the "National 4-H Club Camp," was changed to *National 4-H Conference*. Prior to 1959, delegates slept in tents on the grounds of the National Mall in front of the Department of Agriculture (USDA) in Washington, DC. In 1959, the meeting moved from the National Mall to the newly founded National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, MD (right outside of Washington, D.C.).

Chaperones

Qualifications

Adults, age 21 or older, who have a strong interest in youth development, are experienced at chaperoning youth, and are a:

- SDSU 4-H Youth Program Advisor; or
- SDSU Field Specialist; or
- Registered South Dakota 4-H Volunteer without restrictions.
- Preference will be given to applicants without children on the trip.





Responsibilities

- Representing SDSU Extension 4-H Youth Development per the South Dakota Code of Conduct; serves as a role model; provides a safe and caring environment for all youth delegates
- Ability to chaperone all youth delegates within the framework of the trip's itinerary
- Willingness to listen to ideas from all youth and provide appropriate feedback
- Enforcement of rules and expectations for all youth to ensure appropriate behavior per the South Dakota 4-H Code of Conduct, the specific trip's Code of Conduct and the South Dakota 4-H Dress Code
- Participate fully in the trip activities, providing supervision and guidance to all youth delegates from the trip's start to its' finish

The form is due to the State 4-H Office, on or before January 1, 2020.
