Entry fee per item is: Adults \$2.00 and Youth \$1.00. They will be judged with ribbons given to 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each class. A Best of Show will be picked in Each Department for Adults & Youth. All Open Class items will be on display August 5th & 6th during the County Fair.

Changes from the 2021 State Fair Book

- For the 2022 SD State Fair, there will be an August 9th registration deadline for all entries (Dog and Companion Animal Shows, Livestock, Youth-in-Action, and Display Exhibits).
- Entry Limits have been set by each department. There are no overall caps on exhibit entries by participants. Please see each department for the specific entry limit.
- Communications Committee
 - In order to alleviate technology issues and provide smooth transition between each presenter, youth are **REQUIRED** to bring their digital presentation on a USB flash drive. Internet access is not a guarantee nor is access to online cloud sharing platforms (i.e. Box, iCloud, Google Drive, etc.).
 - A remote clicker will be available for the youth to use
- Consumer Decision Making Skill-A-Thon
 - Seniors will have two sets of check-type questions.
- Horticulture Skill-A-Thon Written Tests
 - Junior: Environment and Horticulture Plants & Vegetables
 - Seniors: Fruit & Nut Production and Garden Flowers
- Robotics and Engineering Challenge Layout
 - Robotics: Youth participating in this division will design and build their own robotics course. Full details and scoring will be outlined in the Robotics Challenge Packet.
 - Engineering: Youth participating in this division will design and build a device to protect an egg when dropped from a specific height. Full details and scoring will be outlined in the Robotics Challenge Packet.
- Special Foods
 - Thursday will have two sessions.
- Premier Livestock Exhibitor Award
 - The State 4-H Office will be implementing the Premier Livestock Exhibitor Award in 2022. This contest will utilize the participants Livestock Skill-a-thon score (September event in Brookings) or other approved animal Skill-a-thon, the State Fair Showmanship score, and the State Fair Market/Breeding Show Score to determine the category winners.
- SD 4-H Livestock Integrity Pledge
 - The Livestock Integrity Pledge will be implemented during the 2022 4-H year.
- Rabbit
 - All Rabbits being shown in 4-H **MUST** be caged by Friday, Sept. 2 at 8:00 p.m.
 - Showmanship: Sun., Sept. 4, 12:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. at pre-scheduled time slots
 - Show: Mon., Sept. 5, 8:00 a.m.
 - Skill-A-Thon: Sat., Sept. 3, 4:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. at pre-scheduled time slots
 - The Show and Go option has been removed for 2022.
 - The date for determining the age class of a rabbit is the day of South Dakota State Fair judging (September 5, 2022).
 - Exhibitors may enter four animals.
- Companion Animal
 - When signing up for the State Companion Animal Show you will need to pick a time frame that you would prefer. The committee will then assign you a time. Times will be emailed out prior to the show.
 - Youth will have a 10-minute time limit on presentations.
 - Awards will be sent home with the County Program Advisors during State Fair.
- Dairy Cattle
 - Check in: Thurs., Sept.1, 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. and Fri., Sept. 2, 3:00 – 4:00 p.m.
 - Entry Cards will not be distributed during check in.
- Dairy Goats
 - Toggenburg removed from Lots. They will show in AOB lot.
 - Entry Cards will not be distributed during check in.

- **Meat Goats**
 - Commercial/Wether Dam divisions split into separate divisions: Commercial Breeding Does shown by date of birth and Wether Dams shown by weight.
 - Wether Dams and market goats will be weighed during check in and placed into classes according to weight. Registered and Commercial breeding meat goats will be brought to check in to verify identification.
 - Exhibitors who earn a “callback” or invitation into Top 5 Overall Showmanship Drive will earn a purple ribbon. All other exhibitors will receive a blue ribbon.
- **Breeding Sheep**
 - Show will take place on Sept. 3 at 8:00 a.m.
 - Update to health information needed for Rams 6 months and older.
- **Market Sheep**
 - Wool-Type Breeds are moved to AOB.
- **Beef**
 - Beef may move in starting on Wed., Aug. 31 at 6:00 p.m.
 - Check in moved to 4-H Livestock Complex with weigh ins and ultrasounds.
 - The 4-H Beef Committee reserves the right to check animal tattoos.
 - Show harnesses are the preferred way to hold entry cards and back tags.
 - No Steers will be allowed on the fairgrounds prior to the move in date and time.
- **Sheep**
 - Counties have the option to not split classes by breed type at their 4-H Achievement Days, especially if numbers within that breed type do not merit a class. Youth will show their market sheep by breed type at the South Dakota State Fair.
 - For time efficiency, this year each class entering the show ring will be required to be a minimum size of 12 head regardless of weight distribution. Unless the division is smaller in size, in which all animals in that division will be shown together as a division championship regardless of weight.
 - All market sheep are weighed and divided into classes by breed type. Market sheep are shown from lightest to heaviest with ewe classes shown first. Determination of breed type will follow the South Dakota State Fair 4-H Division Market Lamb Breed Type Guidelines. A breed type classifier will be present during market lamb weigh in. Decisions on breed type are final.
- **Market Swine**
 - Market Swine must be tagged AND ear notched.
- **General Livestock**
 - During the check in process at the State Fair, committees will weigh animals for the purpose of sorting weight related classes appropriately. The weigh-in process will discontinue the central check in area and move check in back near the appropriate livestock barn.
 - Livestock exhibitors will acknowledge the Livestock Integrity Pledge during online registration.
 - At the committee’s discretion, livestock weights may be checked during line-up to ensure that significant fair-week weight gain or loss has not occurred. If so, livestock will be moved to the appropriate heat/class later in the show.
 - There will be no parking of tack trailers on State Fair grounds.
- **Showmanship**
 - Beef and Swine Showmanship contests will use the “Gate-Cut” method. At the designated time Senior Showmen will be called to the make-up area. The first 8-12 (appropriate number for arena being used) will be allowed into the ring as the First Heat. The class will be judged, purple ribbon showmen will be selected to return for the final drive, and the class will be excused. All subsequent heats will follow the same process. The show’s Committee Chair will determine the number of heats to be judged for each age division and make a final call from the show ring no less than 3 times to announce the final heat, allowing all exhibitors equal opportunity to participate.

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South Dakota 4-H Livestock Integrity Pledge

Introduction: The 4-H Livestock Integrity Pledge takes the refreshing approach of placing trust in 4-H parents and youth. We trust that our parents want 4-H to serve as a place for their youth to develop into contributing members of society—builders not takers. We trust that our youth want to be true 4-H'ers—desiring a good exhibition experience and willing to demonstrate personal responsibility.

This pledge is a required component of SD4-H's livestock education program. Prior to agreeing, please read, consider, and adopt the Livestock Integrity Pledge's principles in your livestock management plan and show preparations.



PLEDGE AGREEMENT

As a true 4-H'er, I pledge to uphold all of the livestock integrity standards listed in this document. I also pledge to make sure that any individuals who help me with my livestock projects uphold the same standards. If I discover that I (or my helpers) can no longer uphold this pledge, I will withdraw from the 4-H exhibition.

Handling and Care

1. In the process of training my animal, I will take great care not to strike my animal without cause or with harmful force.
2. To promote safety to others and myself, I will ensure my animal is trained and under control before participating in any livestock exhibition.
 - a. For haltered animals, I will use an appropriate, properly fitting halter.
 - b. During the exhibition, I will guide and direct my animal without striking.
 - i. During swine exhibitions, I will use my show stick as a guide not a weapon.
3. Though exhibiting livestock is fun, the main purpose of raising livestock is to produce safe food for consumers.
 - a. As a result, I will:
 - i. Provide adequate and regular food and water, timely and veterinarian-approved medical care, and appropriate shelter and/or fencing.
 - ii. Own/lease and care for my animal from at least June 1 of the current year through the end of this exhibition season or harvest, whichever comes first.
 - iii. Use a timely and responsible harvest plan.
 - b. Specifically, I will not:
 - i. Use drugs in an extra- or off-label manner without a valid veterinary-client-patient relationship.
(Extra- or off-label drugs cannot be used for performance enhancement.)
 - ii. 'Hold off' or force-feed my animal when not part of a treatment plan.
 - iii. Withhold water or 'drench' my animal when not part of a treatment plan.





Ethics and Co-opetition*

1. I will take an active role in grooming/fitting all of my exhibits in preparation for the exhibition. I will only enter the number of exhibits that allow me to take this active role in grooming/fitting each animal.
2. Regardless of my skill level or the day I am having, I will show all of my own exhibits unless I am sick/injured or I am showing in another 4-H activity at the same time. I will only enter the number of exhibits that make it likely I can show my own exhibits.
3. Other than developing my skills and preparing my exhibits, I will not unfairly influence the outcome of the exhibition.
 - a. Specifically, I will not:
 - i. Taunt, harass, or harm another exhibitor or event personnel.
 - ii. Touch another exhibitor’s animal without permission unless in an emergency.
 - iii. Contact the show judge prior to the show or during a break in the show.
 - iv. Artificially alter the weight of my animal or intentionally declare a false weight.
 - v. Inject air or other foreign materials into my animal.
 - vi. Perform any other prohibited act listed in the National Show Ring Code of Ethics.
4. If a younger or less experienced 4-H member comes to me for advice, I will help them. After all, by raising their skill level it will provide a more worthy challenge for me.
5. I will wear appropriate attire in the ring and will not use my attire or brand to influence a judge.
6. Though I may become emotional in the moment, overall I will celebrate my victories with humility and losses with grace.

Consequences

If I discover that I (or my helpers) can no longer uphold this pledge, I will withdraw from the 4-H exhibition. Should 4-H personnel directly observe me violating this pledge, I understand they will enact appropriate disciplinary measures within the SD4-H *Code of Conduct*.

Being a State 4-H Ambassador is a challenging and rewarding role with the South Dakota 4-H Youth Development Program. Young people selected to serve as a State 4-H Ambassador can expect the following:

Objectives:

- Prepare individuals for roles as leaders, mentors and problem solvers
- Enhance skills in communication, public speaking and critical thinking
- Focus on foundational life skills
- Develop skill specific career exploration
- Provide positive youth-adult partnerships

Roles of a State 4-H Ambassador:

- Serve to support the 4-H program through public relations
- Function as a positive role model for youth in South Dakota
- Abide by South Dakota 4-H Code of Conduct both during and outside of 4-H events
- Continually strive for improvement by serving as an agent of change
- Promote inclusion and respect for diversity across 4-H
- Utilize skills and knowledge gained through 4-H to engage youth in educational activities
- Pro-actively engage in youth-adult partnerships

Applicant Qualifications:

- Must be a registered 4-H member in good standing
- 4-H age 14-18 based off of the 4-H year
- Must submit all application material and information requested
- Participate in interview to be held at the State Fair (in-person or virtually)
- State 4-H Ambassador applicants must apply each year

State 4-H Ambassador Program Requirements:



