Steers will be split by breed and then weight.

- Heifers are split by breed and then by age with fall heifers born in 2018 eligible to show per SDJPS rules. All other calves must be born in 2019.
- This show will be divided according to sanctioned rules.
 The British division is for British Straightbreds only.
- Registration papers/means to acquire papers are encouraged for all breeds or you are subject to show commercial.
- Calves entered <u>must</u> be accompanied by a <u>current health</u> certificate
- All exhibitors must check-in at 4-H Building on the Grounds before unloading trailers
- No washing facilities will be available
- · All decisions of Show Committee and Judge will be final
- Calf Show Committee will not be responsible for accidents
- All bedding must be cleaned up or forfeit premium—a manure bunker is available on the south end of grounds

We are excited to announce that your SD 4-H Leaders Board has added the SDSU Youth Livestock Judging Camp to the list of camps that offers financial assistance. There is a \$50 scholarship available to any 4-H member that attends the camp. Other camps with a scholarship available are 4-H Camp at Poinsett, 4-H Youth Camp or Teen Camp at Bob Marshall, Teen Leadership Camp (TLC) and Performing Arts.

Here is how the scholarship program works.

- Step 1 Register for the 2019 camp and pay the full camp fees.
- Step 2 Attend camp and have a great time!!
- Step 3 Tell a group about camp. For the \$25 4-H Camp scholarship, tell one group. For the \$50 TLC or Performing Arts Camp or Livestock Judging scholarship tell two groups.
- Step 4 Complete the camp assistance/scholarship application form with all signatures and submit to the SD 4-H Leaders. You will receive your scholarship money within 2 weeks of its receipt. Applications are due by December 31, 2019.

**Please note – you must be a 4-H member to receive the scholarship.

Please be sure to complete all parts of the form! You must answer the "what did you learn" section and sign it!

2020 Citizenship Washington Focus Trip

What is CWF?

CWF is a week-long 4-H citizenship program for 4-H'ers, thousands of which come to the National 4-H Youth Conference Center in Chevy Chase, MD, each summer, to learn about the democratic process, their role as citizens, and experience our nation's capital. The 2020 South Dakota Delegation will travel to CWF June 20 - 28, 2020.

Who can participate?

4-H'ers ages 15-18, as of January 1 of the trip year are eligible to attend CWF. Contact the 4-H Youth Advisor for your County to determine other county-specific steps to apply for CWF. Counties give their selected CWF youth delegates initial instructions and forms in December to send to the State 4-H Office on/before January 10.

What does CWF cost?

The cost for the 2020 CWF is \$1,700 per youth delegate (transportation, lodging, and most meals). Some Leader Associations provide scholarships. Youth delegates should plan to bring approximately \$300 in spending money.

Thursday: Workshops, sightseeing & Cultural Heritage Evening Friday: Delegation Day on the National Mall & Talent Show

Saturday: Leave Maryland via coach bus

Sunday: Arrive in South Dakota

County Selection Process

CWF youth delegates are selected at a County level based on local policies and procedures. Delegates must be able to perform the following essential functions of the trip with or without reasonable accommodations:

- Age-appropriate social & intellectual skills to actively participate in all activities
- Physical stamina to walk long distance & endurance for participating in a 16-hour day

The State 4-H Office and the National 4-H Council coordinate registration, transportation, lodging, some meals, activities and events for the South Dakota delegation.

South Dakota 4-H'ers wishing to participate in CWF need to contact their 4-H Youth Advisor to find out if their County has CWF delegate reservations. If yes, then youth and their families need to complete the application steps the County and State 4-H Office require.





2020 National 4-H Conference Trip

Members of the South Dakota 4-H Program, have the opportunity to apply for National 4-H Conference scheduled for March 28 – April 2, 2020 in Chevy Chase, Maryland. Youth must be 16 – 18 years old by the date of the event to apply. Applicants should submit their applications to their local 4-H Youth Program Advisor. Upon approval, the 4-H Youth Program Advisor will submit the signed application, via email or USPS mail, to the State 4-H Office by January 1, 2020. A designated committee of 4-H Youth Development professionals and/or previous trip participants will review applications and notify youth who are selected to attend National 4-H Conference as a delegate. The National 4-H Conference trip is sponsored and fully funded by the South Dakota 4-H Livestock Industry Trust Fund.

The National 4-H Conference is a premier professional and leadership development event for 4-H members, ages 16 – 19, across the U.S. and its territories. The conference is administered by the National 4-H Headquarters of the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) within the **U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)**. Held annually, except for several years during World War II, the camp's mission is to assist in the development of the next generation's leaders. Delegates attend training workshops, become acquainted with government and have the opportunity to meet with state leaders. This experience has been a tradition for 4-H members since 1927. In 1958, the event name, formerly known as the "National 4-H Club Camp," was changed to *National 4-H Conference*. Prior to 1959, delegates slept in tents on the grounds of the National Mall in front of the Department of Agriculture (USDA) in Washington, DC. In 1959, the meeting moved from the National Mall to the newly founded National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, MD (right outside of Washington, D.C.).

Chaperones

Qualifications

Adults, age 21 or older, who have a strong interest in youth development, are experienced at chaperoning youth, and are a:

- SDSU 4-H Youth Program Advisor; or
- SDSU Field Specialist; or
- Registered South Dakota 4-H Volunteer without restrictions.
- Preference will be given to applicants without children on the trip.





Responsibilities

- Representing SDSU Extension 4-H Youth Development per the South Dakota Code of Conduct; serves as a role model; provides a safe and caring environment for all youth delegates
- Ability to chaperone all youth delegates within the framework of the trip's itinerary
- Willingness to listen to ideas from all youth and provide appropriate feedback
- Enforcement of rules and expectations for all youth to ensure appropriate behavior per the South Dakota 4-H Code of Conduct, the specific trip's Code of Conduct and the South Dakota 4-H Dress Code
- Participate fully in the trip activities, providing supervision and guidance to all youth delegates from the trip's start to its' finish

The form is due to the State 4-H Office, on or before January 1, 2020.
