We will continue our Pick-a-Chick program this year! Youth ages 5-18 are able to purchase exhibition type show Bantams (smaller than many farm chickens you may be familiar with) for \$6 per chick. Chickens do best in groups; it is recommended to get a minimum of 5, even if you do not plan to show all 5. Chicks will be picked out on a first-come first serve basis; no requests for specific chick breeds.



Chicks need to be paid for at pick-up in March. Please let the office know before <u>January 5</u> if you are interested in purchasing a bird. At that time we need to know how many birds you would like so we can send in an order. If you change your mind before March, there is no charge and the birds will find other homes, but it will be very hard to receive a bird in March if you were not on the initial interest list.

At first, chicks need to be kept in basements or garages in a box with a heat lamp until they feather out. If this is a concern for anyone, let us know and we will discuss what options would be best for you to care for a bird.

*Special Note: Birds purchased through this program are for 4-H use and cannot be shown in open class at the South Dakota State Fair.

County Selection Process

CWF youth delegates are selected at a county level based on local policies and procedures. Delegates must be able to perform the following essential functions of the trip with or without reasonable accommodations:

- Age-appropriate social and intellectual skills to actively participate in all
- Physical stamina to walk long distances and endurance for participating in a 16-hour day
- registration, transportation, lodging, some meals, activities and events The State 4-H Office and the National 4-H Council coordinate for the South Dakota delegation.

South Dakota 4-H'ers wishing to participate in CWF need to contact their 4-H youth advisor to find out if their county has CWF delegate reservations. If yes, then youth and their families need to complete the application steps that the county and state 4-H offices require.



Non-Refundable Payment Schedule

- January: The first payment of \$1500 is due to the State 4-H Office with the county's completed reservation form.
 - February: CWF delegates' completed forms and the second payment of\$725 is due.
- April: The final payment of \$725 due to the State 4-H Office.

South Dakota 4-H Trip Application to the National 4-H Conference



Members of the South Dakota 4-H Program, have the opportunity to apply for National 4-H Conference scheduled for April 19-24, 2024, at the Hyatt Regency Crystal City in Arlington, Virginia. Youth must be 16-18 years old by the date of the event to apply. Applications need to be submitted to the applicant's 4-H Youth Program Advisor. Upon approval, the 4-H Youth Program Advisor submits the signed application, via email or USPS mail, to the State 4-H Office by January 22, 2024. A designated committee of 4-H Youth Development professionals and/or previous trip participants will review applications and notify youth if they are selected to attend National 4-H Conference as a delegate.

NOTE: 4-H youth in South Dakota are awarded one trip per calendar year to represent the State 4-H Program at a national 4-H event/conference. Eligible youth may reapply in future years for trips in which they have not yet participated.

Application Process. To apply for this trip, applicants and 4-H Youth Program Advisors need to submit a portfolio of the following items. DO NOT SUBMIT the member's 4-H Journal or 4-H Record Books as part of this application.

- Cover letter (one typewritten 8½" x 11" page with one-inch margins, using a 12 point font; sample copy is provided in this packet please replace with applicant's cover letter)
 - Describe your definition of 4-H Citizenship and Community Service.
 - Describe what you learned through 4-H Citizenship and Community Service that makes you a better person and citizen for your club, community, country and world.
- Résumé (one typewritten 8½" x 11" page with one-inch margins, using a 12 point font; sample copy is provided in this packet – please replace with applicant's résumé)
 - List the 4-H member's name, complete address, county, contact information including email address and phone numbers.
 - Describe the size and scope of two of your 4-H project areas, focusing on goals set/achieved and skills/ knowledge gained.
 - Describe the leadership skills you have attained through 4-H activities, events and opportunities.
- One Page of Photos (Optional) with captions showing 4-H leadership work and accomplishments.
- Non-Confidential Letter of Recommendation (commenting on skills relevant to your selection) from one of the following:
 - 4-H Club Leader
 - 4-H Youth Program Advisor
 - School employee
 - Employer
 - Pastor
- Checklist completed with required signatures.

Participants are responsible for the entire cost of the trip. The price to attend National 4-H Conference will be determined when the registration fee has been announced and the number of youth attending from South Dakota has been determined. Potential costs for four youth to go is \$3,300.00 per youth.

The National 4-H Conference is pleased to offer financial assistance to 4-H youth and adult chaperones to maximize opportunities for those who otherwise would not be able to attend Conference.
