South Dakota 4-H Performing Arts Registration is Live

The South Dakota 4-H Performing Arts Camp is June 9 - 15, 2024. South Dakota 4-H Performing Arts is a 7-day performative experience at Northern State University (1200 S. Jay Street, Aberdeen, SD 57401) for youth ages 13 (or have completed 7th grade) to 18. The camp provides the opportunity for youth to gain skills in musical theater performance.

The South Dakota 4-H Performing Arts Camp experience provides:

- A deeper dive into 3 areas of performing on stage: vocal performance, dancing, and acting.
- The opportunity to perform vocal solos, dance solos, and speaking parts.
- Experience learning from experts in the theater arts.
- A better understanding of self along with learning about leadership, teamwork and responsibility.
- Youth interested in participating as Stage Crew are welcome to attend! Stage Crew may attend the full week at full price, or a partial week at a reduced rate.

The youth will perform at the South Dakota State Fair August 31st to September 2nd. All participants must be present for the duration of the fair. Any conflicts during the fair must be noted at the time of registering for 4-H Performing Arts Camp, must be school or 4-H-related only, and will be taken into consideration when assigning solos and acting roles.

- Check-in: Saturday, August 31, 8:00 a.m.
- Rehearsal: Mandatory rehearsal on August 31 from 8:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Optional practice on Friday, August 30 from 7:00-8:00 p.m.
- Performances: Saturday, August 31 at 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Sunday, September 1 at 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday, September 2 at 10:00 a.m.

The cost of registration is \$425. The registration deadline is May 31. An early registration discount of \$25 ends on May 15. Families with more than one camper attending will also receive a \$25 discount by selecting the "Family of 2 Youth Participants" ticket at checkout. If you are in need of financial assistance, we encourage you to apply for the Jayna and Kylee Sanborn Scholarship. 4-H Members may also apply for a \$50 scholarship through the South Dakota 4-H Leaders Association. In an effort to build confidence and strengthen personal presentation skills, members will introduce themselves during the style show. Each member's personal introduction will include their name, 4-H county affiliation, and one additional personal fact. For example: *Good afternoon. My name is Jill Jackson and I am an eight year member of the Classy Clovers 4-H Club in Green County; or Welcome to the SD State Fair! I'm Jack Johnson. I represent Dandy County 4-H and am also active in the beef project. This is my 3rd year in 4-H.*

The shift to 4-H members introducing themselves will foster the growth and development of creating a strong first impression, using positive vocal qualities, maintaining eye contact, confidence, and poise. Strengthening these skills now will benefit members throughout their lifetime.

During the personal interview and outfit showcase, senior 4-H members will build upon their introduction by incorporating a short oral presentation (1 - 2 minutes) including information about the garment being modeled, learning experiences or activities related to the project area, future project/personal plans, and any other information related to their 4-H career.

In addition, complementing an outfit through the use of accessories as finishing touches will help youth reach their total look goals. Consider achieving your *wow* look through the use of basic accessory categories such as footwear, jewelry, hair accessories, handbags, belts, and seasonal accessories (scarves, hats, gloves, sunglasses).

Focus on shape, color, texture, line, rhythm, emphasis, proportion, balance, and unity to create your head turning look.

Changes/Clarifications from the 2023 State Fair Book

- For the 2024 SD State Fair, there will be an August 13th registration deadline for all entries (Companion Animal Shows, Livestock, Youth-in-Action, and Display Exhibits).
- General Livestock Updates
 - Animal Lease Agreement forms and regulations have been updated. Please see the Animal Lease Agreement and Animal Lease Requirements Fact Sheet documents on the SDSU Extension website for more information.
 - Registration papers must be uploaded by August 13 to the entry on Fair Entry, and it must be in the exhibitor's name or immediate family member's name. If purchased, registration must reflect ownership as of June 1. If leasing, registration papers must be in the animal owner's name.
 - All large animal showmanship contests (Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, Sheep, and Swine) will use the "Gate-Cut" method. Exhibitors may register on Fair Entry prior to State Fair, but it is not required.
 - All small animal showmanship contests (Poultry and Rabbits) will show in their scheduled time slots. Exhibitors are required to sign up for showmanship on Fair Entry prior to State Fair to select their time slot.
 - Youth that participate in State Fair Showmanship, State Fair Breeding/Market Shows, and State Skill-a-thon contests will be eligible for the Premier Exhibitor award. This award is divided into Large Animal and Small Animal + Dairy.
 - Port-a-Coolers are prohibited on all State Fair properties. Butt fans are only allowed at tie-outs where electricity allows.
 - Tack stalls in the DEX will be available for \$90/tack stall upon online entry. One tack stall consists of two ties. Only one tack stall per family/address is allowed. If a family is found having a tack stall without paying the fee, they will be asked to either remove their tack or pay the fee at that time. Failure to comply may result in further disciplinary actions at the discretion of 4-H staff.
 - o Once checked in, all cattle must remain in the immediate proximity of the DEX unless traveling to tie-outs.
 - No livestock are allowed in the campgrounds.
 - All 4-H beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, sheep, swine, poultry, and rabbit exhibitors must be certified through an approved 4-H Youth Livestock Literacy (YLL) program. The County Extension Office is responsible for selecting in 4-H Online that the youth completed a YLL program by July 1 of the current year.
 - All market animals in Market Beef, Market Goat, Market Sheep and Market Swine intended for 4-H competition at the South Dakota State Fair are required to submit DNA samples. A DNA sample must be self-identified and submitted to the County Extension Office by June 1 of the current year for State Fair eligibility.
 - All Market Animals, Crossbred Breeding Swine, and Wether Dam Goats that are shown by weight must declare a weight and turn them into the show officials during check-in. Once a weight has been submitted, the weight cannot be changed. Scales will be available to weigh the animal prior to declaring the weight. Weigh-backs will occur immediately after the class for the top 3 purple ribbon animals in each class. The animal must weigh within 5% of their declared weight or they will be immediately excused from the show and will not be eligible for awards. Should a top 3 purple ribbon animal be excused, animals that placed outside the top 3 will not be retroactively granted access to the remainder of the show; rather, there will simply be less than 3 animals from that class that proceed.
 - To be eligible for all Purebred or Registered Market or Breeding Shows (Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Breeding Meat Goat, Breeding Sheep, and Swine), 4-H exhibitors are required to upload a copy of the animal registration papers (in their name or immediate family member's name) to their entry in FairEntry by August 13. Registration paper must reflect ownership as of June 1 if purchased. If leasing a purebred animal, an animal lease form must be submitted by June 1 and registration papers in the animal owner's name must be uploaded to their entry on FairEntry by August 13.
 - For safety purposes and security of livestock and personal property, the South Dakota State Fair has established a "Quiet Time" in all barns that starts at 2 AM until 5 AM. Large gatherings, parties or excessive socializing will be prohibited at that time. Thank you for your cooperation.

- All Beef Exhibitors will need to follow the designated route to the tie outs. Walking Beef down Livestock Avenue is not allowed. Walk animals in the vicinity of the 4-H Livestock Complex. Sheep and Goats are not to be North of 3rd Street, East of Livestock Avenue, South of 4th Street, and West of Guard Drive.
- Display Exhibits
 - The following areas were updated: Foods and Nutrition (cookie size), Photography (mounting board), Music and Dance (no DVD), and Visual Arts(Christmas Ornament Lot).
 - Family & Consumer Sciences Skill-A-Thon (CDM)
 - The name of the Skill-A-Thon has been updated from Consumer Decision Making Skill-A-Thon to Family & Consumer Sciences Skill-A-Thon (CDM).
 - This Skill-A-Thon is an individual contest. There are no teams in the Family & Consumer Sciences Skill-A-Thon (CDM).
 - Juniors will judge one class chosen from child development, clothing and textiles or foods and nutrition.
 Juniors will complete a 15-question multiple choice quiz. Questions will be chosen from the definitions from the three ID categories.
 - Seniors will not judge a class. Seniors will complete a 25-question multiple choice quiz. Questions will be chosen from the definitions from the three ID categories.
- Horticulture Skill-A-Thon
 - The time of the Horticulture Skill-A-Thon has been extended to 11:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m.
 - The Junior Study Guides used for the written test will be *Plant Propagation* and *Managing Trees and Shrubs* (*Managing Woody Ornamentals in the Landscape*).
 - o The Senior Study Guides used for the written test will be Greenhouse Structures and Plant Nomenclature.
- Youth-In-Action Communications Project
 - o 2 blank Public Presentation scorecards are to be sent to the State 4-H Office.
 - The Project Why Presentation Type has been removed as a presentation type.
- Robot Showcase and STEM Challenge
 - The Robot Showcase will take place on Friday, August 30.
 - See the 2024 South Dakota 4-H Robotics Showcase Packet for rules related to the Robotics Showcase.
 - See the South Dakota 4-H STEM Challenge Packet for rules related to the STEM Challenge.
- Poultry Skill-A-Thon
 - Senior contestants should not use their notes when giving oral reasons or points may be deducted for doing so.
 - Time will be allowed for contestants to prepare their reasons.
 - Awards will be announced and distributed on Monday, Sept. 2 at 10:00 a.m. on the west side of the poultry barn.
- Special Foods
 - The Revive with 5 (or Fewer Ingredients) Challenge has been added to Special Foods. This challenge will take place during Shift 6 (Friday at 2:30 p.m.) and Shift 10 (Saturday at 2:30 p.m.)
- Companion Animal Show
 - The Companion Animal Show will take place at the Lake County 4-H Grounds in Madison, SD.
- Beef
 - No tents or canopies are allowed at the DEX.
 - The ultrasound evaluation program will be discontinued beginning in 2024.
 - Breeding Beef Lot name updates: Limousin and LimFlex (25% to 100%), Maine-Anjou (75% to 100%) "Brown" papers required, Mainetainer (25% to 62.5%) "Green" papers required, and Maine-Angus "Blue" papers required.
 - o Butt fans are **only** allowed at tie-outs where electricity allows.
 - Tack stalls will be available for \$90/tack stall.
- Dairy Cattle
 - Dairy Cattle exhibitors have the option to wear their exhibitor t-shirt provided by South Dakota 4-H.
 - Dairy Cattle exhibitors can wear white or black pants.
- Dairy Goat
 - In showmanship, Dairy Goat exhibitors have the option to wear a white t-shirt or blouse, or their exhibitor tshirt. White or black pants preferred but not required.
 - o Removed Alpine breed lot.
 - o CVI's must be turned into the Dairy Goat box in the Livestock Complex.
- Meat Goats
 - \circ $\,$ Only registered does must be present at check in to verify tattoos and tags.
- Poultry
 - Absolutely NO birds are allowed on the grounds that are not registered in the 4-H show.
 - Once a bird is checked in, its class cannot be switched.
 - Added Welsummer to Single Comb Clean Legged Bantam breed lot.
 - o Added Rhode Island Red and Rhode Island White to Rose Comb Clean Legged Bantam breed lot.
 - Added Modern Game Bantam as its own class.
- Rabbit
 - 4-H rabbit event question time with advisors will take place Friday, Aug. 30 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

- o Rabbit barn hours are 9:00 a.m.-8:00p.m. daily. The barn will open at 8:00 a.m. on show day.
- Added Blue Holicer to Any Other 4 Class Purebred breed lot.
- Rabbit Hopping will be held on Friday, Aug. 30 on the Farm Bureau Dakotaland Stage from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Each showmanship participant is required to provide their own carpet square.
- Breeding Sheep and Market Sheep
 - o Breeding sheep lots combined Commercial Meat Type Ewe and Commercial Wool Type Ewe.
 - Removed Montadale breed lot.
 - Market Lamb check-in will be Thursday, Aug. 29 from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
 - All Market lambs must be present at check ins to be breed classified and checked for fungus.
- Breeding Swine and Market Swine
 - Swine check ins will be on Friday, Aug. 30 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.
 - Only one person is allowed with the youth and their animal in the staging area.
